Instrumental support is the process of transactions that require direct assistance or aid. In the field where I deal with catheters insertion, instrumental support is crucial for helping the patient to understand the process and make it easy. It is also essential for explaining how to take medication, as well as the right dosage and the right time to take it. Emotional support refers to being concerned about the emotional state of another person. In my field, emotional support is of paramount importance. Patients expect a nurse to understand their pain and empathize with their conditions. This way, the patient can open up and give more information on their condition. Lastly, appraisal support is paramount in my current profession. Appraisal support refers to expressions or affirmations by one person showing agreement with another person's point of view. Patients need to feel that the nurses agree with what they are saying. Even in situations where the nurse

disagrees with what the patients say, it is important to listen to the health consumers and give their opinion afterwards in a positive manner (Villarruel et-al, 2001).

Social science also helps one to understand people's culture and its effect on a particular individual. For instance, there are some communities that are very social. Thus, in the event that one member of the family is sick, they will all visit him due to concern. A nurse who understands this will be able to handle the extended members of the family, who come to visit the patients, without offending them. According to social science ethics, as a med-surg-floor RN who has to administer an injection to a patient when the family members are in the room, I would ask them to excuse us for a moment for the good and well-being of the patient (Pender, Murdaugh & Parsons, 2002). This way, the family members would understand and step outside willingly.

Nurses' knowledge of social science can play a crucial role in changing the profession. Nurses need to take time to understand human behavior and be able to address the patients based on their backgrounds. It will enable nurses to empathize with the patients and feel their pain. The nursing profession will be better when they understand why different people behave in different ways. Consequently, nurses will give individualized attention to each patient. This will have an impact on quick recovery of the patients (Villarruel, Bishop, Simpson, Jemmott, & Fawcett, 2001). Furthermore, social science theory will help nurses to improve their listening skills.
